**NOTE:** The “Deer Donation Registry” is a public service program created and maintained by the *North Carolina Bowhunters Association (NCBA)*. Be informed that it is unlawful for anyone to sell wildlife in North Carolina. The “Recipient” named above may accept as a “gift” the carcass of any lawfully taken wildlife animal. As part of this program, it is the responsibility of the “Recipient,” after accepting possession of any animal, to process the animal and dispose of any excess body parts in a lawful manner. It is also the “Recipients” responsibility to either process the meat themselves, or pay a meat processor (butcher) to process it. It is also the “Donors” responsibility to provide the information required by law and listed above in this form to the “Recipient.” The “Recipient” and “Donor” should retain a copy of this information for their record. The only obligation the “Donor” (hunter) has is to deliver the field-dressed animal to the “Recipient” at a pre-determined time and location. The “Donor” also has the right to retain possession of the head and hide of the animal, if he/she so desires.

“Donors” (hunters) should strive to harvest only doe (or antlerless) deer in order to maximize the effectiveness and achieve the objectives of this program, which is designed, and was created to assist the NCWRC in controlling and managing the deer population in North Carolina at healthy and acceptable levels.
